

# Reducing the risk of *Legionella* pneumophila in the home

#### Domestic warm-water systems

- Ensure the temperature is set to the maximum.
- Regularly clean outlets by soaking them in boiling water or disinfectant.
- Run hot water through outlets for 5 minutes if the property has been vacant.

# Irrigation systems

- Appropriately treat rainwater and bore water systems.
- Set irrigation systems to run overnight rather than during the day.

# Nebulisers

• Masks should be rinsed after each use. Clean the cup and mask saily with warm water and dishwashing liquid. Allow all components to air dry.

# **CPAP** Machines

• Clean and disinfect as per manufacturer's recommendations.

#### Caravans

- Empty and clean water storage tanks when caravan is not in use.
- Run hot water through outlets for 5 minutes if the caravan has been vacant.

# Misting systems

• Clean and disinfect as per manufacturer's recommendations.

# Aerosol producing equipment

• Clean and disinfect as per manufacturer's recommendations.

#### Domestic evaporative air conditioners

- Ensure system is serviced by a professional annually, before the first use of the summer season.
- If the system doesn't automatically dump water when switched off, the system may be able to be modified to do this.

#### Spas

- Appropriately maintain pH and Chlorine levels.
- Clean and disinfect as per manufacturer's recommendations.

#### Humidifiers

- Empty, and clean in warm water and dishwashing liquid. Allow all components to air dry.
- Only use distilled water or water that has been boiled.

# Fountains

• Regularly drain, clean and disinfect.

#### Ice machines

• Clean and disinfect as per manufacturer's recommendations.
