Program eligibility and provider groups

| Program | Cohorts | Provider group | Start and end date of program |
|-----------------------------------------------------------|----------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------|--------------------------|------------------------------------|
| Catch-up program | Children born between 1 October 2023 to 30 April 2024 | GPs, WACHS, CAHS, AMS | early April – 30 September 2024 |
| Newborn program | Babies born in WA between 1 May to 30 September, 2024 | Antenatal hospitals | 1 May – 30 September 2024 |
| High risk children entering their second RSV season | Children (aged 8 -19 months) entering their second RSV season who have a medical condition placing them at-risk for severe RSV disease | GPs, WACHS, CAHS, AMS | early April – 30 September 2024 |

Authority to immunise

- Structured Administration Supply Arrangement (SASA)
- AIR reporting mandatory under the SASA
- Immunisation Schedule will be updated to include nirsevimab before 1 April

Education requirements to administer RSV

| Immunisation Provider group | Education Requirements |
|---------------------------------------------|------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------|
| Registered and Enrolled Nurses | AHPRA SA Health Immunisation Learning Courses or a HESA equivalent Online WA Health RSV module (coming soon) |
| Registered Midwives | AHPRA. SA Health Immunisation course for Midwives or a HESA equivalent Online WA Health RSV module (coming soon) |
| Aboriginal Health Workers and Practitioners | AHPRA. WA Health/AHCWA Immunisation course Complete the online WA Health RSV module (coming soon) |

- Stickers that can be added into the National Woman Held Pregnancy Record (NWHPR) as a prompt to discuss Program with women at antenatal visit

Reporting requirements

- 1. Immunisation administration:
 - AIR will accept nirsevimab reporting

- 2. Adverse event reporting
 - Report all adverse events to the WA Vaccine Safety Surveillance System
 - About Western Australia SAFEVAC Reporting
