The Problem

Sharps are not always disposed of **appropriately**....

Appropriate means into a sharps container and disposed of as medical waste.

Inappropriate disposal leads to:

- Public health risk
- Litter problem
- Work Health and Safety issue
- Waste management problems



The Program

Aim to increase the number of public place sharps disposal options


- Funding from Department of Health to WALGA
- Sought Expression of Interest from Local Government
- Bulk Procurement of Sharps Containers and signage
- Locations for Sharps Containers uploaded on DoH website, so central source of information



The Program

What we achieved

- 23 Local Governments installed 285 sharps units across WA
- Shires of Dandaragan, Jerramungup, Esperance, Boddington, Bridgetown-Greenbushes, Chittering, Collie, Cuballing, Derby-West Kimberley, Dowerin, Dundas, Trayning, Waroona, Wickepin, Williams, Wongan Ballidu and Woodanilling
- Cities of Belmont, Fremantle, Greater Geraldton, Kalgoorlie Boulder and Karratha
- Town of Mosman Park
- Mainly in public toilets



Sharps still an issue

- Some sites are experiencing ongoing vandalism of the units
- 3 units washed away in Derby floods....
- This is only part of the solution.
- We need pharmacy take back options and products stewardship for these products – so end of life management is fully funded and there is clear pathway for all users.
