Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) vaccine update

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is the most common cause of respiratory and breathing infections in children and is a common cause of bronchiolitis and pneumonia in children under one year old.

In this seminar Prof Englund will provide an update on the work being carried out on the RSV vaccine which aims to protect infants, young children and pregnant women from severe RSV infection.

Prof Janet Englund's research interests include the study of vaccine-preventable diseases and viral respiratory diseases in young children and immunocompromised hosts. As a member of the National Institues of Health (NIH)-sponsored Seattle Vaccine Treatment and Evaluation Unit, Prof Englund is involved in the evaluation of new respiratory virus vaccines including live-attenuated parainfluenza virus vaccines through collaboration with Johns Hopkins University and the NIH. Prof Englund's research group is actively studying the epidemiology of respiratory viruses and viral vaccines in diverse populations, including infants, children, and pregnant women.


