Service profile (cont.)	 Bereavement support Care coordination. A full range of clinical services available on site comprising of pathology, medical and radiation oncology, chemotherapy, global diagnostic services – including MRI and PET.
Allied Health Services	 Access to generalist allied health professionals, including: Dietician Occupational Therapist Pharmacist Physiotherapy Social Worker Specialist Pastoral Practitioner.
Admission criteria	 Adults over the age of 18 years, experiencing life-limiting illnesses who have specialist palliative care needs, which are unable to be met within their current place of care. Patient is aware of referral to palliative care. A SJGBH accredited Medical Practitioner must accept patient prior to admission. Exclusions: Patients awaiting nursing home placement (CAP) Infants and paediatric patients Respite care.
Referral process	Medical referral required by email to carolyn.masarei@sjog.org.au
Palliative care discharge criteria	 The care of palliative inpatients may be transferred to the South West Community Palliative Care Service when discharge information has been discussed with the patient / primary carer and where: Home is the preferred place of care The patient's condition has stabilised and all symptoms are adequately controlled A multi-disciplinary team assessment has been undertaken A comprehensive Carer Needs Assessment has been completed Adequate level of ancillary services are organised Alternative care arrangements may be made in consultation with the patient and family when home is no longer a viable option for care.
