SUBJECT: School Canteens & Imposing Fees and Charges

Notice Number:10.5Date of Issue:17/11/2010

Distribution of Notice:

Local government enforcement agencies

Purpose of Notice:

To seek consistent application of fee for school canteens.

Action:

Local Government Authorities to use their discretionary powers in exempting the payment of fees for school canteens run by not-for-profit groups.

Background

School canteens are food businesses under the Act and are required to be registered with the relevant local government enforcement agency. The purpose of registration is to provide the enforcement agency with a mechanism to approve food businesses operating within their districts and to have knowledge about their operations so that decisions about appropriate surveillance activities can be determined.

The Act enables local government enforcement agencies to impose fees and charges related to the performance of their functions under the *Local Government Act 1995*. Fees can be charged for the registration of a food business and for the covering of costs associated with annual surveillance activities.

The Department of Health (DOH) is aware that many local government enforcement agencies have adopted this approach but a distinction is often made between school canteens run by not-for-profit groups and those run by food businesses.

Current Situation

Local government have the ability to exempt school canteens from the application of fees associated with registration and/or surveillance activity.

There is inconsistency across a number of local government districts on the imposition of fees and charges upon school canteens run by not-for-profit groups. The DOH has received a number of concerns from various stakeholders on this matter which has resulted in the issue of this Food Unit Notice.
