# You received the Zostavax<sup>®</sup> vaccination on:

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Keep this information on your fridge or close by for the next four weeks as a reminder.

## Common side effects

The most common side effect following Zostavax<sup>®</sup> vaccination is soreness at the injection site.

## Seek immediate medical attention if you:

- develop a chickenpox-like rash within 2 to 4 weeks of vaccination
- feel unwell
- develop a fever.

Tell your doctor that you have recently received Zostavax<sup>®</sup>.
